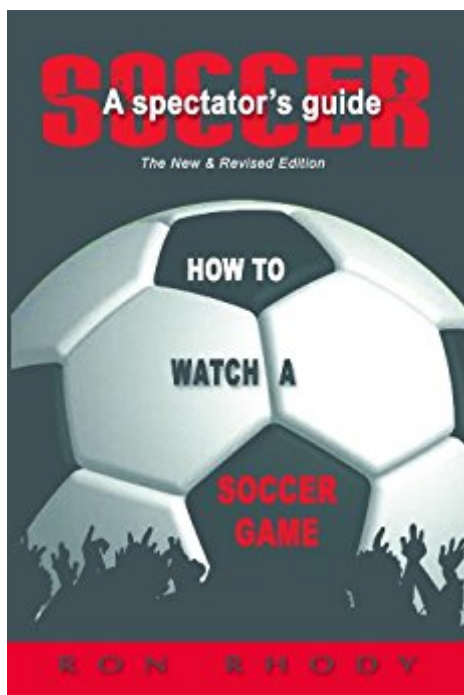

all the fuss was about, and this little book was just the thing. I have read it during this World Cup, and have enjoyed each game more than the previous one. I think I might just become a real soccer fan -- especially since I found out that my home town, Kansas City, has a Major League Soccer club, so now I have a team to support!!'d recommend this book to anybody who, like me, never played soccer as a kid, but now as an adult has become interested enough to want to know what's going on with all those guys running around out there. :-)

This is a really well-written book, and I recommend it to anyone who would like a systematic introduction of the game.
