

I ordered this and another quite different book in preparation for a trip to Svalbard. There was more information than was applicable to me but the writing style and content was interesting enough that I read nearly all of it anyway. The history was probably what interested me most. We won't be camping or trekking but those sections were interesting to read to try to learn what life is like there. If

you are going to Svalbard you really do want to read this book: it covers everything from the history, terrain, weather, clothing you need, and what sort of protection to take along with you if you are going "out there". This book is literally packed with page after page of useful, interesting and worthwhile information.

This is a good, dense book full of information. It probably has both too much and too little information. There is a lot of good stuff there for someone spending a lot of time in Svalbard, but not enough stuff for someone trying to plan a short trip there. Also, it is not up to date enough (which is a difficult task) to list all the current tour vendors or give you enough information to decide which excursions are worth doing. Still, there is little other information out there, even on the internet, so if you are going to visit for a few days or longer, I recommend the book. Just read it before you get there...
