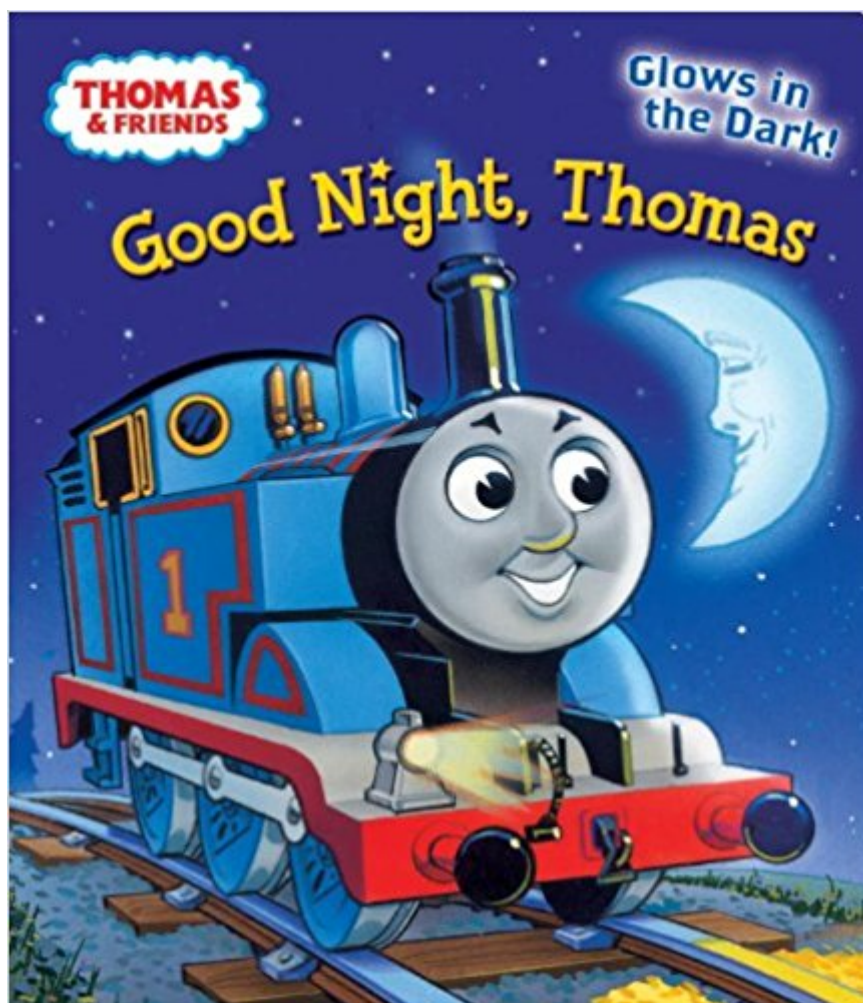

My nephew not only loves this book, he is ready for a new ritual as he looked through it and declared that it was his new bedtime story. He still wants it every night. Many thanks to the author

Not the greatest plot but I guess that's okay considering I'm reading it to my 2 year old - I can get over that. The bigger issue that's hard to overlook: the Glow In the Dark feature only works if you 'charge' each of the pages with a light. As a nighttime book to read when most of the room's lights are off, you don't really get the full experience. If you also have a toddler, you'll know that taking the time to do that isn't exactly practical each time you read it to them. So...it's basically just another book on the shelf. Not sure how they could make that aspect any better...should have thought about it before buying.

The fact that the front cover glows is cool, but it has to be under light for so long. Not to mention it'd be too much of a pain to get the whole book to glow as you'd have to keep all the pages open under light. It is sturdy though and my 3 yr old seems to enjoy the glow, plus he loves the moon so he enjoys that and pointing out the "crescent". I feel almost silly saying this, however the story itself leaves much to be desired. I mean I'm pretty positive, but it just leads no where and does nothing to spark their imagination or teach anything. Which is kind of funny, because that's what the show is all about is learning lessons. I mean it's a really poorly written story and when you get to the end it's like, "That's it!?". I almost don't want to read it to him anymore because of it, but it would be fine for a younger kid I guess. I bought it for my 1 yr old anyway so I guess that's more age appropriate.

Not that a kids book needs an elaborate plot or developed characters, but this book is lacking in all departments and never kept my sons attention at any age.

Doesn't really glow in the dark-disappointing. Very short and simple book best for young toddlers- book rated for older - my almost 3 year old son loves Thomas so we're keeping the book but it's too basic for him.

Even when you either hold a flashlight or under a light to activate the "glow" it's very low. Other than that a cute story.

This story is lacking for sure! Basically Thomas sees a star, goes to look for it finds Percy instead and is too tired to keep looking so he goes to bed...all this is 10 pages.
