

an engineer overnight...and certainly NOT for the novice, as at least one reviewer suggested...it took me many years to get to the point where I could read AND comprehend what Mr. Case is saying in this wonderful and useful book...it's one of a very few books on mixing/engineering that I'll never sell...another being Alexander Case's book "Sound FX"...

Mix Smart is the perfect text for the aspiring mix engineer. As one might expect from anything written by Alex Case, this book finds the perfect intersection between the technical theory and the artistic endeavor that is mixing. Wonderfully organized into a series of chapters covering commonly used techniques, Mix Smart takes the reader through the entire mix process from planning to printing. Handfuls of charts, graphs and waveform diagrams within each chapter offer objective validation to the many traditions and tropes of mixing, and suggestions for how these techniques may be effective in your own mix. For the beginner, this research instills thoughtful decision making that can be brought to every mix in the future. For those who are unsure that they've heard such techniques used before, each chapter also comes with a listening list, highlighting exemplary or otherwise unique examples of each topic covered. Finally, for the engineers who have practiced these techniques for years, a scientific exposition of how they work may offer new creative alleys.

This is a solid book, without a doubt. The author knows his stuff, and the chapters are easy to understand. All the good reviews for this book are correct, so I won't duplicate them here. However, I ordered Â Sound FX: Unlocking the Creative Potential of Recording Studio Effects Â by the same author a few days beforehand. When 'Sound FX' arrived, I spent that whole weekend reading it and eagerly anticipating the arrival of 'Mix Smart' for more yummy goodness. Then I received 'Mix Smart' and discovered that most of it is the same material, usually word-for-word, that I had just read in 'Sound FX'. The illustrations and graphs are the same. I even had both books in front of me and compared section-for-section and paragraph-for-paragraph. In a nutshell: to these eyes, it is a revision of 'Sound FX', not a new book. There are some worthwhile tweaks here and there, but not enough to warrant keeping both, so I'm returning 'Mix Smart'. I'm not crying foul play at all. The author even addresses the question of which to get on his website. I'm sure this is not the first time a 2nd Edition has featured a new title; maybe it was the publisher's idea. At first, I wasn't even going to mention the whole thing. But since the return will cost me \$3.99 and a trip to the UPS store, I figured a disclaimer would be fair to save others the trouble.

Prof. Case is one of smartest guys I know. I feel this book is for people who are starting out in audio.

Case addresses everything every audio engineer should know in a clear and concise manner and doesn't leave you having to reread sections over and over. What I would like from Prof. Case though is a book that gets into the nitty gritty points of audio, like his lectures in his Audio Theory class that blows your mind, or rather lets you feel confident in what you're talking about. Everyone interested in audio should read this book.
