

Buddha, Vol. 7: Prince Ajatasattu





Synopsis

Osamu Tezukaââ ¬â,¢s vaunted storytelling genius, consummate skill at visual expression, and warm humanity blossom fully in his eight-volume epic of Siddharthaââ ¬â,¢s life and times. Tezuka evidences his profound grasp of the subject by contextualizing the Buddhaââ ¬â,¢s ideas; the emphasis is on movement, action, emotion, and conflict as the prince Siddhartha runs away from home, travels across India, and questions Hindu practices such as ascetic self-mutilation and caste oppression. Rather than recommend resignation and impassivity, Tezukaââ ¬â,¢s Buddha predicates enlightenment upon recognizing the interconnectedness of life, having compassion for the suffering, and ordering oneââ ¬â,¢s life sensibly. Philosophical segments are threaded into interpersonal situations with ground-breaking visual dynamism by an artist who makes sure never to lose his readersââ ¬â,¢ attention.Tezuka himself was a humanist rather than a Buddhist, and his magnum opus is not an attempt at propaganda. Hermann Hesseââ ¬â,¢s novel or Bertolucciââ ¬â,¢s film is comparable in this regard; in fact, Tezukaââ ¬â,¢s approach is slightly irreverent in that it incorporates something that Western commentators often eschew, namely, humor.

Osamu Tezuka (1928-89) is the godfather of Japanese manga comics. He originally intended to become a doctor and earned his degree before turning to what was then a medium for children. His many early masterpieces include the series known in the U.S. as Astro Boy. With his sweeping vision, deftly interwined plots, feel for the workings of power, and indefatigable commitment to human dignity, Tezuka elevated manga to an art form. The later Tezuka, when he authored Buddha, often had in mind the mature readership that manga gained in the sixties and that had only grown ever since. The Kurosawa of Japanese pop culture, Osamu Tezuka is a twentieth century classic.

Prince Ajatasattu, whom this book is named, does not like Buddha and tries to kill him, an action with great consequences for all. Ananda struggles to find redemption for his murderous

past. And Devadatta proves to be less holy-minded then he has led others to believe. After much time Buddha relives he's been ideal in his work. And heads to his former kingdom, to spread his teachings and confront Prince Crystal. Like other volumes, the art work and storytelling is wonderful.
