

The publisher categorizes this series by readability, and this book, a level one, is written for kids who are just learning to read on their own. The text, therefore, is concise and contains plenty of sight words. Silly riddles and interesting trivia dot the pages, and the maps included live up to the standards set by other National Geographic Kids books. Full-color photographs are not only engaging and attractive but also serve to provide context for emergent readers. A picture glossary is included in the back matter.
