I finished reading Melissa Explains It All by Melissa Joan Hart. I have been trying to finish this for quite some time, but much like my last autobiography, there was something that kept me from completing it. I must have instinctively known it was going to be bad, otherwise I would have had a

hard time putting it down. I don't want to delay the inevitable, so I will just come out and say it in one word. Disappointing. My exposure to Ms. Hart was purely through her show Sabrina. I really loved her in those episodes. Guess I failed to realized is that I loved her character. I don't even know the woman behind the character so how can I "love" her. I thought the book would be entertaining, but what I found was boring stories about her partying and drinking. What I once thought as a cute and gifted actress, after reading this book, I see her as arrogant and pretentious. It's sad really. There was no "heart" from Hart. There were areas where she just droned on and on, but others where she didn't go into enough detail. Perhaps the most enjoyable part of the book was when she met her husband and started on down that path of serious dating, engagement, wedding and marriage. And why not write more about her other relationships outside of the "guys" she used to date. If she was expecting her readers to feel sorry for her poor choices in men, it didn't happen with this reader. I didn't expect to read about Hart being "normal." What I did hope to read was a relatable book by a 90s star who did not get eaten by fame. 2.5 stars. Overall, I was disappointed with this book. I picked it up because I was a big fan of Sabrina and Clarissa growing up, and I definitely would not recommend the book to people who aren't fans of Hart's shows. Even as a fan, I had a lot of issues with the book. Something about the tone of Hart's writing just made the book seem very self-serving to me. Hart didn't come off as particularly likable - rather, she seemed a bit braggy. I also thought the organization was a bit weird - it started out chronologically, but then jumped around topically, which sometimes made it confusing because you weren't sure how old she was during certain anecdotes. Finally, I took issue with a lot of the attitudes she expressed during the chapter on football. It's fine not to like sports, but the way she wrote the chapter seemed to really give in to outdated stereotypes about women and sports.

Melissa Joan Hart made commercials when she was a little kid, performed on stage as a pre-teen, was the title character on Clarissa Explains It All in her teens, Sabrina on Sabrina the Teenage Witch in her 20s, and Mel on Melissa and Joey in her 30s, and in between all that made some TV movies and started a production company with her mom, too. In her memoir, Melissa Explains It All, she is quite forthcoming about guys and drugs and partying and admits that while she probably wasn $\tilde{A}f\hat{A}\phi\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a}$   $\neg\tilde{A}$   $\hat{a}$ ,  $\phi$ t much different from many 20-somethings she really only made it to adulthood with her squeaky clean image because she never got caught doing naughty things.
