

Theology often stirs expectation (fears really) of stuffy, boring, irrelevant religious science. Patmos breaks that expectation and discards the fear. Reading it connects you with the original passion of the gospel writers. Here comes your most important choice....union or separation? Did God come to humanity in the incarnation as Jesus, teach us what a righteous life could look like, bear our sins on the cross, rise again to prove he did it right, then ascend to heaven and leave us separated but with an opportunity to find our way there by 'finding' him? Or...did Jesus come to us as the one sent by the Father to find us, reconcile us to his Father and ours, and gather us into his very life and face-to-face relationship (union) with the Father by destroying the power of sin, death, and deception in which we were all ensnared? In reading Patmos, I experienced a very clear, life-giving, and entertaining nudge to help me confidently engage and answer these most important questions. I recommend this book with great enthusiasm.

Don't sleep on this one! Get the book. I've practically lived my life on a pew reading books hid inside my bible listening to preachers drone on and on (never mind that I was a PK AND a pastor's wife) thinking to myself there has to be more, there has to be more. In the pages of books like The Shack and now, Patmos, I have truly discovered "the more"...its union. I feel like someone has handed me a rare gift that I don't want to share with anyone and yet can't possibly keep to myself. It has great humor, drama, but most importantly - it includes some great theology. It may be fiction, but the reader will be truly inspired in one's understanding of John's writings.

With all the down-to-earthness of Baxter's previous writing and teaching, blended with an incomparable vision of the oneness and love between the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit and our participation, we are drawn into a compelling dialogue that opens our hearts and minds to the

Baxter and I grow up in the same part of Mississippi at the same time and under the same cloud of foggy mixture-the good of southern religious culture and the BAD of southern religious culture. Baxter did the hard demanding work of a theological education coupled with a tenacious hunger for truth and came through the fiery furnace of inner conflict to become a masterful expounder of the true heart of God found in the gospel. Do not fear you will encounter the confusing angry schizophrenic god of tradition nor the wispy goofy god of new age wishful thinking. NO you will encounter the LIVING GOD, the consuming fire who so hates evil and loves us that He will die to give Himself to us and to take us into Him. Woven amidst familiar (to me) Mississippi humor is a masterful treatment of theology, history, psychology, philosophy and engaging story telling. Stay away from this book if all you are looking for is a rehashing of the same confusing theology that has hijacked the title or 'orthodoxy.'
