

was stationed at NATO in Naples, Italy and lived in an apartment overlooking the Bay of Pozzuoli where the 601st conducted practice landing for both the Anzio and Southern France landings. In the early 1980s he served as the Assistant Naval Attaché in Rome, Italy. A later tour found him as the Director of the US Navy Science and Technology Group, Europe in Munich, Germany. He is a graduate of the US Foreign Service Institute (Italian) and the Defense Language Institute (German). After retirement he worked in the private sector as a consultant helping small businesses enter new markets. He was also a government consultant do contract work for the US Department of Energy and NASA. He lives in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia with his wife Patricia. The author lives in Middletown, VA.

Excellently researched and written first-hand account of a tank destroyer battalion who fought from North Africa through Italy, and France. Their most difficult journey ended in southern Germany at VE day. From the earliest models of tank destroyers with low-velocity ammunition that bounced off of Germany Panzers to the hi-velocity ammunition that decimated German armor, but was propelled by a gasoline engine which ignited when hit, the ability to survive was determined by creativity, maneuverability, and audacity (not to mention great courage). A fine read for the WWII or military history enthusiast.
