

As a father of three young children, I have often wrestled with how to best teach my children the Bible's grand story of God's redemption. Having a full-time job, a yard to keep up, homework to help with, etc... this task has been all the more challenging. Starr Meade's Grandpa's Box is a wonderful resource for busy parents who desire to pass their Christian faith on to their kids. Grandpa's Box sticks close to the stories that emerge right from the pages of Scripture, retelling them in a way that will hold a child's attention and interest. "Daddy would you please read another one?" is not uncommon to hear after I've concluded reading a chapter to my children. A helpful outline is provided at the end of the book that gives a brief summary of each of the book's 42 short chapters. Discussions questions that are appropriate for children are also available on the publisher's website. What I especially appreciate about Mrs. Meade's works (Grandpa's Box, included) is that she so tactfully presents the great themes of the Bible in ways that children are able to relate to and understand. Other children's devotionals often focus on moral lessons while overlooking the primary message being conveyed by the various passages of Scripture they cite. If you're looking for quality biblically-based material to help instruct your children, you won't go wrong with Mrs. Meade's excellent books.

We read through this one a few months ago and absolutely loved it! As a mom, I want my kids to understand and remember all the stories from the Bible, but it gets hard finding great resources that

you can use to tell the same stories in slightly different ways to help them remember better and get more out of them. This book is a gem! Was such a unique way to present the stories of the Bible, and we all loved it! Can't wait to read through this one again!
