All of life was to be done as an expression of their love for God. Jesus did everything for his heavenly Fatherâ Â[™]s glory. This is what Jesus does. Jesus makes life better. Jesus brings the better wine. Jesus takes empty religion and ritual, and brings it to life for everyday people. He takes what many deem holy (like the water in the ceremonial cleansing jars) and brings it to the party. He breaks down the barrier between what people might call sacred and secular. Jesus makes all things sacredâ Â"including wine at a party. We donâ Â™t go to church. We are the church sent out into the world.â Â• Jesus didnâ Â™t live, serve, suffer, and die so we could just attend a Christian event. He lived and died so we could become his people who are sent into every part of the world on his behalf.All of life counts and everyone matters.Itâ Â™s not activities and events that are primarily Christian. Itâ Â[™]s people. Activities and events, by themselves, are not sacred, but people are. you ever taken time to dream about what God might want to do in and through you where you live and work? Jesus prefers normal, weak, and broken people.All Godâ ÂTMs people, everywhere, filling everyday life with his presence. This has always been Godâ ÂTMs vision for his people.

Jeff shares some much needed perspective on what it might actually look like to BE the church. He explains the Biblical support for his opinions about community, discipleship, evangelism, etc. while also coming down to very practical levels on every subject he covers. My only "problem" with the book is that it was a bit hard to follow at times. Disclaimer: it is worth taking the time to push through parts that may seem hard to get through because each part is really necessary to have a good understanding of what he is trying to communicate - a lifestyle of discipleship to Jesus in close relationships with other Christians as well as those far from God. Well worth your time to read if you're interested in a more grassroots movement of Christianity

Jeff does a great job of articulating what it looks like to be a Christian every single day. I love how transparent and approachable Jeff is. In particular, I love the story of getting angry, hurting his hand, just before Easter and then preaching with a cast on good Friday and Easter and telling the story of his failure, but God's redemption, that's awesome! I've been trying to get a handle on what a missional community group actually is and this book answered it well. The book is not about abandoning Sunday morning gatherings, but is about living on mission and what that actually looks like. There are great illustrations of how to apply the principles, but now there are MANY questions of what this needs to look like in our context.
