


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Art & Religion In The 21st Century

Dr. Aaron Rosen is Professor of Religious Thought at Rocky Mountain College and Visiting Professor at King's College London. He taught previously at KCL, Yale, Oxford, and Columbia, and received his PhD from Cambridge. He is the editor of Religion and Art in the Heart of Modern Manhattan and co-editor of Visualising a Sacred City: London, Art and Religion.
