

Growing up I heard a lot of folk tales about Paul Bunyan. I was very amused by those stories. This book puts them all together for me. Very enjoyable to read. Lots of fun in these pages.

Just plain stupid.The stories are barely readable, as the author must render everything, even Paul Bunyan's supposed writing, in words such as loggin', figgurin' (with a double g), mixin', huntin', turnin', catchin', smokin', comin', goin', evenin', 'er (her), and 'em (them).The book beings: "If what they say is true, Paul Bunyan was born down in Maine. And he must of (sic) been a pretty husky baby too, just like you'd expect him to be, from knowin' him afterwards."A few paragraphs later: "And I guess the old folks must of (sic) had their hands full with him all right.""must of"? Really? This is how the book starts. You can make an acceptable contraction of "must have" (must've), and if you were to pronounce that contraction, it might sound like "must of," but only a functional illiterate would put "must of" in writing.I understand the author is trying to give the feeling of an authentic dialect, but what she gives us is a painful caricature. I don't want to sit by a campfire with someone who talks like that. I want to use her book as fuel. My copy is going in the garbage. I've got kids learning to read, and I don't want them picking up crap such as this book and assuming that it contains writing.
