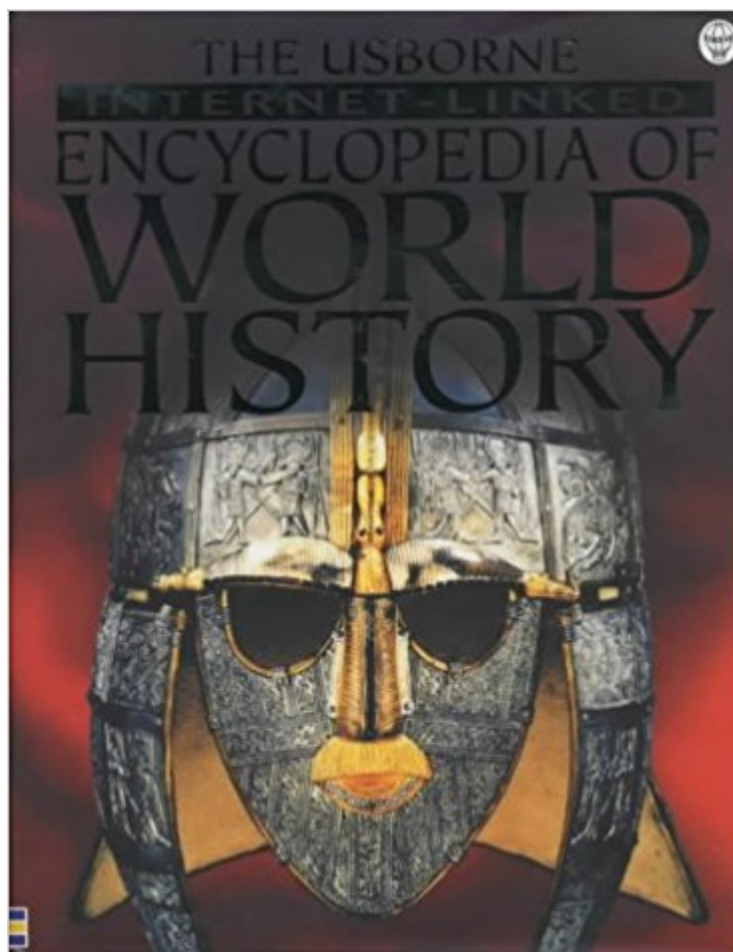

For while there is a LOT of history within it, a lot of segments are but a page or two long, but that's to be expected. It is wonderful for overviews of information, touching on high points, and giving incentive to look into other sources for more.

I have many reference books on my shelves and this one gets used more than many of the others. If you can't get a world book encyclopedia set, then this is a good one. My youngers really like the illustrations and can garner a fair amount of information from each topical page. The internet links are somewhat helpful, most of them could probably be googled. Overall, if you can get this used or on sale and have younger kids and a history based curriculum, this is a good choice.

We use the Charlotte Mason method of homeschooling. This book was on one of the booklists. My 7 year old loves looking at all of the detailed pictures. It catches her interest and makes her want to know more about each time period. We use the book as a supplement along Child's History of the World and Mystery of History.

I bought this book at the request of my homeschooling sister. She says that she and her almost 5 year old read a few pages a day and are already halfway done with the book. She says each section is brief, but would help to build a broad basic knowledge. It is a good starting point for deeper research. I looked it over before I gave it to her and it is a very appealing book. It is full of illustrations that look like they would be hours of educational entertainment.

This is the best history book that i have seen in a long time. There is so much information packed into this one book, and that's not all they also have great illustrated pictures on each page and internet links in case you would like to learn more about the specific topics. This book thoroughly teaches each topic with plenty of history on each page. It also has a whole section on dinosaurs and the different types of dinosaurs that lived in different periods then continues throughout history all the way to whats currently happening now. I love this book and i think it is great for teaching home
