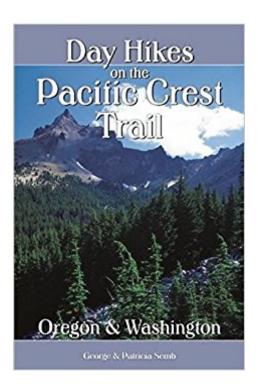


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Day Hikes On The Pacific Crest Trail: Oregon And Washington

This would be a good book for serious or experienced hikers, it is very clear and well written directions to day hikes on the Pacific Crest trail. Unfortunately the hikes are pretty beyond my fitness level, so I had to give this book a four stars because there was nothing really for a beginner or a "wimp" or people with small children or with a handicap, that sort of thing. The hikes described are pretty much all a higher difficulty level (20 mile hikes are typical). If you are just starting hiking you would probably have to work up to this book, but if you are at the right skill level and have an interest in hiking the Pacific Crest Trail but not as a through hike this might be the book for you.

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
