

My desire got the best of me-I had to touch that flabby, soft skin. Finally, I could not resist any longer, and my right hand went for it. Once my mom discovered it, she nearly died on the spot. "Lori, stop that right now." She apologized to Mrs. Brown, but the old friend said, "Oh, honey, let her have her way. She's not bothering me; it actually feels pretty good." I thought yes, it does to me too. Well, Mrs. Brown saved me; I didn't get in trouble, and I had a way of occupying my time while on the visits. It also brought smiles to Mrs. Brown's face so how could it be bad? Who knew this was a glimpse of things to come. Life Lesson #1 The young and old have a lot to offer one another, among these are the value of a touch and a smile. I learned at a very early age that it was a pleasant experience to touch an old person and that it was a means of communication
