

Written before the proliferation of genealogical information on the internet (circa 1936), the book tells you how to do your research the "old fashioned" way. It has mch useful information, e.g. how to use libraries and town records, what may be found in wills, and how to prepare for searching overseas. A testament to its usefulness is its multipile editions (this is the fourth edition).
