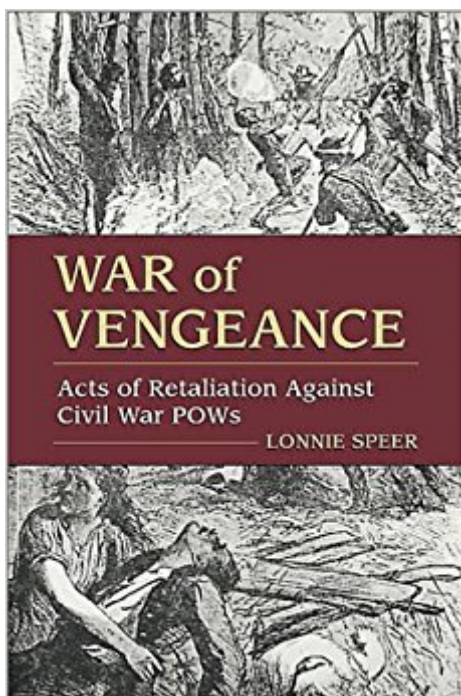

Each chapter of this book undertakes to describe a specific event of retaliatory action. Lonnie Speer takes no sides as he points an accusing finger at both the Union and the Confederacy for their equal parts in treating the prisoners poorly. He explores this little-known wartime violence, focusing on the most notorious and well-documented cases of the practice.

Insufficient detail. Not what I was looking to research about mistreatment of civil war prisoners but perhaps my expectations were too high.

In this modest sized book, Mr Speer outlines a handful of incidents that give face to the cruel passions that the American Civil War evoked. Both Confederate and Federal share the blame in Speer's sampling - from the "random" execution of partisans, to the more deliberate starving of Confederate prisoners in Northern prisons, to Union prisoners being held amid bomb-out Charleston! A nice final chapter gives a brief overview of prisons - which I found to be the highlight of this very short endeavor. Those well-versed in Civil War studies may find little new, but the novice reader will, perhaps, be taken aback at what Speer reveals. I give Speer credit for "naming names" and showing the purposeful role Lincoln, Stanton and Grant played to further the plight of those held in their charge.
