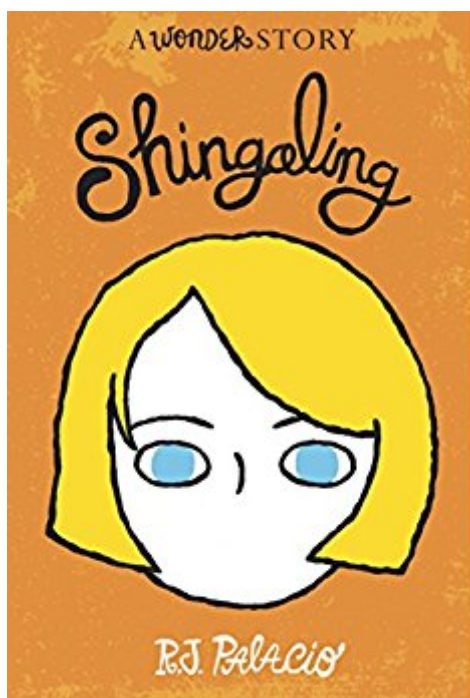

My daughter and I are always looking for any new releases from this series. Her 3rd grade teacher at the time (she's now a 6th grader) read his other book "Wonder" to her class and almost every child, and/or parent, went out and purchased the book within the first week. I love that he is able to portray the characters in a way which shows their "flaws" as well as the deeper soul-searching which goes on in their minds in relation to a boy who is obviously very "disfigured". His books give a voice to those thoughts which go on in all of your heads and the accompanying emotions which go along with it. His books address bullying, compassion, friendship and real love. My daughter also loves his other book which is full of inspirational quotes.

I love Ms. Palacio's work. I fell in love with Wonder, then Julian's Chapter. Now this one. I love how she puts realistic emotions in her characters. Reading this book is like living the lives of the young people who are narrating. They are real and full of emotion. Reading these books is effortless for me. I started and before I knew it, I was finished.

Remember middle school? Welcome back to that perplexing intensity, the beginnings of moral ambiguity, and an annoying feeling that you just are not good enough. This book brought me right back there. Palacio's writing is clear and yet deceptively complex: the characters feel real and their layered situations ring true. It is a fast read for adults, but one that can help us remember that life in puberty is both joyful and difficult and those in the middle of it deserve our patience, attention and respect.

I truly enjoyed reading this book. When I purchased it, I figured it would be something to read before starting a longer, more in-depth book in my usual genres; Science Fiction and Fantasy. Imagine my surprise when I became thoroughly engrossed with this seemingly "small" little story about (not
