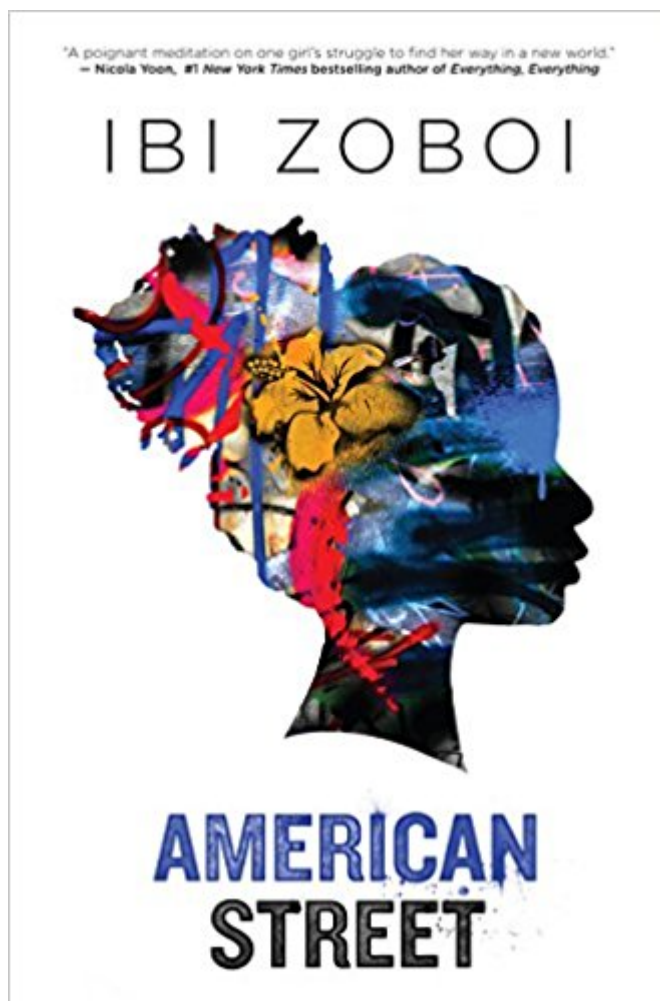

On the corner of American Street and Joy Road, Fabiola Toussaint thought she would finally find *une belle vie* "a good life. But after they leave Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Fabiola's mother is detained by U.S. immigration, leaving Fabiola to navigate her loud American cousins, Chantal, Donna, and Princess; the grittiness of Detroit's west side; a new school; and a surprising romance, all on her own. Just as she finds her footing in this strange new world, a dangerous proposition presents itself, and Fabiola soon realizes that freedom comes at a cost. Trapped at the crossroads of an impossible choice, will she pay the price for the American dream?

So fast paced, so much action!! truly enjoyed this novel considering I did not expect this book to do well. *American Street* is about Fabiola Toussaint who immigrates to America with her mother from Haiti, but upon arrival, her mother is detained at customs, leaving Fabiola to navigate a new country and culture on her own with some help from her cousins and aunt. The theme of this story is based on Fabiola trying to make sense of what happened to her mom and then trying to find a way for her mother to join her. As she begins to settle into her new environment, she meets and falls in love with a young guy named Kasim Anderson. Anderson will teach her about her new world and also serve to temporarily fill the void that Fabiola only desires for her mother. So many events occur that keep the storyline interesting and moving, but I must say, it is also sad. Honestly, I experienced many emotions while reading this book, and when I finished it, I still had all the characters I met in my mind. I finished this book in two sittings, though I did take a break because of work. I gave this book 4 stars on GoodReads, but it is technically 4.5 out of 5.0. Zoboi did a great job writing this book. Our main character, Fabiola Toussaint, is well developed and the theme is real and will resonate with many readers who have foreign blood in them. I enjoyed this book and definitely recommend it.

Fabiola, a Haitian born in the USA, emigrates to America with her mother. A snafu at the border detains her mother so Fabiola greets her cousins in Detroit alone. She is thrust into the energy and poverty of an inner-city high school. The casual violence and verbal abuse is balanced by strong family ties and deep love. Still, Fabiola misses her mother. To try to speed her release, Fabiola agrees to narc on a local drug dealer suspected of giving deadly drugs to rich Grosse Pointe kids. Her spiritual guide is Papa Legba ("Bad Leg") a homeless man whose street corner song hints at the turmoil to come. The school scenes are frighteningly dramatic (fights, threats, little real teaching). Her three cousins lead tough lives: hiding in books, bad boyfriends, and unrequited love, respectively. This reader was saddened to see Fabiola American-ized in this cold world. The plot is gripping if, at times, histrionic. This tale will resonate with inner city youth and immigrants.

I am not Haitian. I am not black. I am a female human and this writing put me there with these characters. I felt their joy. I felt their pain. I was there with them on the streets of Detroit. A hard story to read. I kept wanting to reach out and hug these girls, these women. We are all strong. We have our faith, friends and most of all family to get us through. Thank you, Ibi Zoboi .

A masterful, magical story of grief, displacement, and doing the best one can, even if that means screwing things up. Recommended for those who see gods peeking around corners, young women coming into their own power, and those needing a kick in the empathy gland.

One of 's recommendations (I had just finished Carey's The Girl with all the Gifts, another amazing book) and was pleasantly surprised . I'm pretty sure I'm not the target audience for this story, but nevertheless I read Ms. Zoboi's book with great interest. I don't believe I've read anything this emotionally moving in a very, very long time.

What a heartbreakingly beautiful book! Zoboi's meld of Haitian lore and Detroit life is perfectly rendered and Fabiola is a character any could relate to.

American Street is one of the best books I have read in a long time. This is a very well written book

that reads fast. It addresses some very important issues about American culture, youth culture, and immigration in the US. I thought it was a genius work of art.
